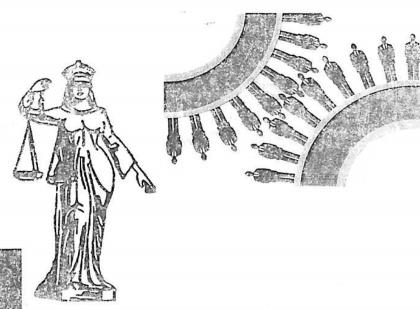
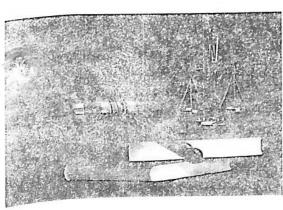

Job satisfaction is simply defined as the affective orientation that an employed has towards als or her work (Price, 2001). In other words, it is an affective exection to a job that results from the comparison of perceived outcomes with those that are desired (Kom, 1998). shortly, job satisfaction describes the feelings attitudes or preferences of individuals regarding work (Chen. 2008). Furthermore, it is the degree to which employees enjoy their jobs (McCloskey and McCain, 1987).

And also, it is possible to see a number of theories developed to understand its nature in literature. Vroom (1964), need/value fulfillment theory, states that job satisfaction is negatively related to the discrepancy between individual needs and the extent to which the job supplies these needs. On the other hand, Porter and Lawler (1958) collect the influences on job satisfaction in two groups of internal and external satisfactory factors. According to them, internal satisfactory factors are related the work itself (such as feeling of independence, feeling of while ement, feeling of victory, self-exteem, feeling of control and other similar teering channel from sort a

whereas external satisfactory factors are not directly related to work itself (such as good relationships with colleagues, high salary, good welfare and utilities). So, the influences on job satisfaction can be also divided into work-related and employee-related factors (Glisson and Durick, 1988). Job satisfaction has been the most frequently investigated variable in organizational behavior (Spector, 1997). Job satisfaction varies and researchers, for example Peretomode (1991) and Whawo (1993), have suggested that the higher the prestige of the job, the greater the job satisfaction. Many workers, however, are satisfied in even the least prestigious job... That is, they simply like what they do. In any case, job satisfaction is as individual as one creetings or state of mind. Job satisfaction can be influenced by a variety of Legal aspects, for example, the quality of one's relationship with their supervisor, the quality of the physical environment in which they work, the degree of fulfillment in their work, etc.

However, there is no strong acceptance among researchers, consultants, etc., that increased job satisfaction produces improved job performance. In fact, improved job satisfaction can sometimes decrease job performance (McNamara, [n.d]; War, 1998). Frederick Herzberg's two factor theory (also known as Motivator Hygiene Theory) attempts to explain satisfaction and motivation in the workplace. This meory states that satisfaction and dissatisfaction are driven by different factors motivation and hygiene factors, respectively. An employee's motivation to work is continually related to job satisfaction of a supordinate. Motivation can be seen as an inner force that drives individuals to attain personal and organization goals (Hoskinson, Porter, & Wrench)

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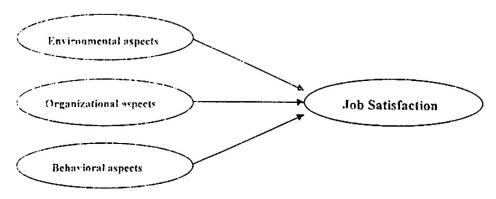


Fig 1: Research Model
